China

Gao Zhisheng is a Chinese Christian human rights lawyer who's been targeted by the authorities because of his work defending human rights. He was 'disappeared' multiple times between 2006 and 2011 and from 2011-2014 he was in prison and unable to see his family or lawyers – since then he's spoken of being tortured during this time. Released in 2014 and placed under house arrest, Gao was then abducted again in August this year. He's currently being held in custody in Beijing, but his family have once again been unable to see him.

Gao's daughter Grace is currently in the UK to talk about her father and what it's been like for her family in this difficult situation.

Please pray:

- For God to provide strength and endurance for Gao Zhisheng in his latest imprisonment
- That Gao would be released soon and able to return to his family
- For God to also provide Grace with energy and strength, both physically and emotionally, as she talks about her father's work.
