The teaching is taken from the Bible and Shembe is revered as a prophet to restore the teachings of Moses, the prophets and Jesus. The Shembe church is called the Nazarite (Baptist) Church.

They always seem to play right outside the venue we have our Friday talks, at the exact same time! This time, we were busy preaching John 14, "Jesus is the way, the truth and the life. Otherwise, I've been enjoying times with the ladies on campus I train on a Thursday afternoon. They've had lots of good questions and good humour!
