


Table Tennis at Church House



Recommended Summer Reads



This inspiring story of Berti's journey from Captain Dosti to Pastor Dosti gives us a glimpse of the explosive growth of the early Albanian church after nearly half a decade of repressive atheism and the untiring efforts of Trans World Radio to broadcast the

Christian message across closed borders to Albanians, who for most of their life had been told there was no God.
